



Projects - autumn Dutch rose wallhanging

2. With right sides together, place a 3" green square and a 3" purple square on opposite corners of a 5-1/2" floral print square. Sew on the drawn lines. Trim the seam allowances to 1/4" and press toward the outside corners.



3. Place a second 3" green square and a 3" dark red square on the remaining corners of the 5-1/2" floral print square. Sew on the drawn lines, trim seam allowances to 1/4", and press. Repeat to make a total of four square-in-a-square units. The units should measure 5-1/2".



4. Use the remaining 5-1/2" floral print square and 4 - 3" purple squares to make the center square-in-a-square unit in the same manner.



Making the Corner Units


1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 6 - 3-3/8" dark red squares. With right sides together, layer the 3-3/8" red squares on 6 - 3-3/8" purple squares.



2. Sew 1/4" on each side of the drawn lines. Cut on the drawn line between the stitching as shown. Press seams toward the purple fabric. Check to be sure your 12 half-square triangles each measure square.




3. Arrange 3 half-square triangles and 1 - 3" floral print square. Sew the pieces together in pairs, pressing the seams in alternating directions. Sew the pairs together to complete one corner unit. Press seams in one direction. Make a total of four corner units. The corner units should measure 5-1/2" square.




Make 4

Making the Flying Geese Units

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 8 - 3" dark red squares and 8 - 3" purple squares as shown.



2. With right sides together, align a 3" dark red square with the right end of a 3" x 5-1/2" tan rectangle as shown. Sew on the drawn line and trim the seam allowances to 1/4". Press the seams toward the dark red triangle.




3. Sew a 3" purple square to the opposite end of the rectangle in the same manner to make a flying geese unit. Make a total of 8 flying geese units. The flying geese units should measure 3" x 5-1/2".



Assembling the Wallhanging Top

1. Lay out the 5 square-in-a-square units and 4 corner units as shown.


2. Sew the units together in horizontal rows. Press the seams of each row to one side, alternating the direction with each row. Sew the rows together. Press the seams in one direction.

3. Join 2 flying geese units and 2 — 3" tan squares to make one flying geese row. Make a total of 4 flying geese rows.




4. Sew 2 flying geese rows to opposite edges of the quilt center. Press seams toward the flying geese rows.



5. Add 3" tan squares to each end of the 2 remaining flying geese rows. Press seams away from the flying geese units. Sew these to the remaining edges to complete the wallhanging center.



6. Sew a floral print triangle to each edge of the wallhanging center. Press seams toward the triangles.



Finishing the Wallhanging

1. Layer the backing, batting, and wallhanging top. Baste the layers together and hand- or machine-quilt as desired.

2. Use diagonal seams to sew the 2-1/4"-wide floral print binding strips together to make one long strip. Sew binding to the edges of the quilt.

3. Trim the extra batting and backing within 3/8" of the edges of the wallhanging top. Turn the binding over the edge to the back and hand- or machine-sew in place.
